Pretty in Yellow

You will detect a sweet fragrance in the air if you pass by a shrub with cream and yellow blooms in LLFB's Fragrant Garden this month. "The scent is magnificent, especially in

the cooler winter air," remarks Marily Floyd, caretaker of this garden located on the east end of the bridge. Edgeworthia chrysantha, also known as Chinese Paper Bush and our current Plant of the Month, "is unusual because it blooms in the winter, usually in mid- to late February in this [western North Carolina] area," Marily says.

In late fall, the plant loses its long, slender leaves, exposing branches filled with silvery, acorn-shaped buds. They become a pretty cream color and point toward the ground, then turn upward as they bloom fully. The outside of the flower remains creamy white while the inside is gold. Edgeworthia is a low maintenance plant that does best in full sun. It can get quite large, so needs plenty of space to grow.

The Flowering Bridge is home to two Edgeworthia plants. You'll also find large specimens outside of the Conservatory at Biltmore House in Asheville, NC.

"Don't miss the opportunity to enjoy the 'scent of heaven' on the bridge," urges Marily. "It's one of my all-time favorite plants. Enjoy!"
